NIPPERS REPORT

Season Overview

The 2025/26 season ran for 18 weeks and saw 173 Nippers take to the beach across U6 to U13. There were 5 weather cancellations across the season, with the program making the most of the Sundays available.

Program Highlights

This was the first season under a new Junior Activity Chair, and it was one of transition and groundwork for the club. Alongside the usual Sunday program, the committee spent much of the season preparing the foundations for 2026-27 - reviewing the uniform ordering process, working through registrar handover planning, and progressing the club's involvement in the proposed shared equipment shed.

A key program change this season was the move to a single, standardised pink rash vest across all age groups, replacing the previous split between the blue/pink vest for U6/U7 and the pink singlet for U8-U13.

The season was supported by 17 Age Managers across U6-U13. Anu Stevens managed registrar duties throughout the season and is stepping down from the role, with Sarah Pateman confirmed to take over for 2026-27. Vanessa Turner joined the committee this season as Uniform Coordinator.

Five U13 Nippers are potentially upskilling to their Surf Rescue Certificate next season.

The Nippers program would not be possible without the help of our volunteers and the community, including:

- Our Water Safety Personnel, including the Juniors who give up their time.
- All Age Managers, for their efforts guiding our Nippers around the beach on Sundays.

Season Results

- Registration Numbers

173 Nippers registered this season across U6 to U13, compared to 228 the previous season. Age-group breakdown was not consolidated in end-of-year reporting this season - available from SurfGuard if required.

- Point Score Champion

Zahli Heywood took out the overall point score for the season. Zahli is part of the McKeon Junior Development Squad and was a standout performer throughout the season.

- Certificates

All Nippers received certificates at presentation day. U6 and U7 received a King of the Hill award, and U8 through to U13 each had a Top Point Score, Most Encouragement, and King of the Hill award.

Presentation Day

The season concluded with presentation day at the clubhouse, including a sausage sizzle, ice cream, and a coffee van. Certificates were presented to each age group as outlined above.

1 Material Accounting Policy Information

The financial statements are a special purpose report prepared in order to satisfy the financial requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act NSW, the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 and the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991.

The committee has determined that the association is a Not for Profit Entity and is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies which are consistent with the previous period, unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the assets and liabilities statement are shown inclusive of GST.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997

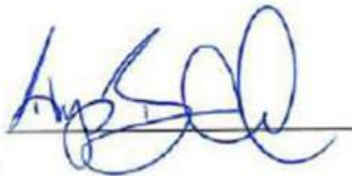

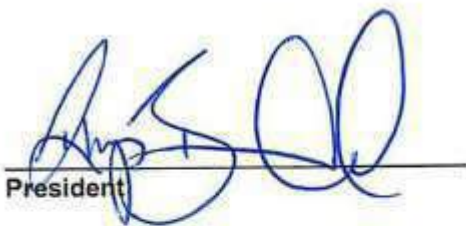

1 Material Accounting Policy Information

The financial statements are a special purpose report prepared in order to satisfy the financial requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act NSW, the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 and the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991.

The committee has determined that the association is a Not for Profit Entity and is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act NSW 1991 and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies which are consistent with the previous period, unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the assets and liabilities statement are shown inclusive of GST.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997

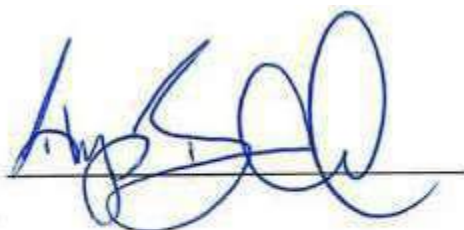

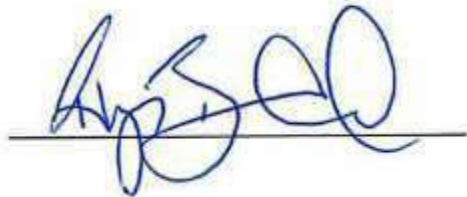

INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF PORT KEMBLA SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB

Qualified Opinion

I have audited the financial report of Port Kembla Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated ("the Association"), which comprises the statement of financial position as at 28 February 2026, statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income, the statement of changes in equity and the statement of cash flows for the year then ended and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of material accounting policies, and the statement by the members of the committee.

In my opinion, except for the effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion section, the accompanying financial report of the Association is in accordance with Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012, including:

- a) giving a true and fair view of the Association's financial position as at 28 February 2026 and of its financial performance for the year then ended; and
- b) complying with Australian Accounting Standards to the extent described in Note 1 and Division 60 of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Regulation 2022* .
- c) the financial report agrees to the underlying financial records of the Association, that have been maintained, in all material respects, in accordance with the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and its regulations for the year end 28 February 2026; and

I have also fulfilled my other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

I confirm that the independence declaration required by Division 60 of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* , which has been given to the Management Committee, would be in the same terms if given as at the time of this auditor's report.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion.

Basis of Accounting

Without modifying our opinion, we draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist Port Kembla Surf Life Saving Club incorporated to meet the requirements of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012, New South Wales legislation the Associations Incorporations Act NSW and the Charitable Fundraising Act for the purpose of fulfilling the committee's financial reporting responsibilities. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.

Responsibilities of Management Committee for the Financial Report
